Division within the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS)

Delaware's state authority for adult behavioral health

Provides, funds, and oversees mental health and substance use services

Promote recovery, resilience, and wellness



Support individuals with serious mental illness and substance use disorders



Build a coordinated system of care



Who We Serve

Adults (18+) with:

Serious and Persistent Mental Illness (SPMI)

Substance Use Disorder (SUD)

Co-occurring mental health and substance use needs

Primarily uninsured or underinsured individuals





Special Populations

Individuals experiencing housing instability

Justice-involved populations

Transition Age Youth

People in psychiatric crisis

Individuals transitioning from hospital to community



Behavioral Health and Civil Rights

People with mental health and substance use disorders are protected under the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)

Protection extends to housing, employment, and access to services

DSAMH upholds these rights through policy and provider oversight
