- 2. Data Retreats required for 20 LEAs based on LEA Determinations (Needs Assistance Year 2, Needs Intervention, Needs Substantial Intervention)
 - a. Co-facilitated with IDEA Data Center Staff
 - b. Developing Root Cause Analysis
 - c. Development of Continuous Improvement Plan
 - d. Focus on Student Proficiency in ELA and Math

DDOE Responsibilities

The Delaware Department of Education (DDOE) Exceptional Children Resources (ECR) Workgroup has developed a Multi-Tiered System of Supervision and Accountability to improve results for children while ensuring compliance with IDEA requirements. This multi-tiered system includes the following components:

- 1, Integrated monitoring activities;
- 2. Data on processes and results;
- 3. The State Performance Plan/Annual Performance Report;
- 4. Fiscal management;
- 5. Effective dispute resolution;
- 6. Targeted technical assistance and professional development;
- 7. Policies, procedures and practices resulting in effective implementation; and
- 8. Improvement, correction, incentives, and sanctions.



Federal Landscape

What we know:

- 1. 250+ staff in the two main offices have received reduction in force (RIF) notices
- Questions being raised whether USDOE will meet its own statutory responsibilities to states and LEAs
- 3. DDOE has received full Part B 611 and 619 funding
 - a. allocations have been made to LEAs
 - DDOE continues to use the Consolidated Grant process to approve LEA allocations
- 4. IDEA has not been repealed
- Both SEA and LEAs remain legally obligated to ensure full implementation of all IDEA requirements
- 6. Families/Students continue to have access to procedural safeguards and dispute resolution process

 - Planning Accessible In-Person Meetings and Events



ADA Title II Rule on Accessibility

DDOE Progress Toward Meeting Web Content Accessibility Standards

- As of 10/16/25 all DOE employees have received face-to-face training on:
 - ADA Title II Rule on Accessibility
 - Basics of Creating Accessible Digital Content
- Workgroups now create new content in an accessible format
- Workgroups are working to update current, previously created content to make it accessible prior to 4/24/26

DDOE Communication with Delaware School Districts and Charter Schools Information and face-to-face training deck has been shared with:

- Superintendents
- District and Charter Instructional Technology Specialists
- District and Charter Technology Managers
- Charter Leads (occurring in November 2025)
