RE: H.B. 328 [Special Education "FAPE" Definition]

The State Council for Persons with Disabilities (SCPD) has reviewed H.B. 328 with H.A. 1, which would clarify the standards used to determine the needs of students with disabilities. SCPD strongly endorses the proposed legislation since it would improve the education of students with disabilities and enable them to maximize their potential.

Lieutenant Governor Matt Denn prepared the legislation to ensure that public schools, special education panels, and the courts use the definition of a free, appropriate public education ("FAPE") adopted by the Third Circuit Court of Appeals. The Third Circuit's precedents interpreting federal law are binding on Delaware but public schools often refer to FAPE descriptions adopted in other jurisdictions which are less student-oriented. For example, districts often invoke a 6th Circuit decision opining that students are "not entitled to a Cadillac-style education but one that is equivalent to a serviceable Chevrolet". The bill essentially codifies the Third Circuit's standards in State law. The amendment clarifies that the standard applies to both the "specialized instruction" and "related services" prongs of a "FAPE".
