RE:

HS1 for HCR 34 Task Force to Investigate Cost of Special Education

The proposed legislation was Report Out of the House Education Committee on 5/9/18. This bill creates a task force to define the reasons behind the "dramatic" recent rise in special education and funding, study the issues related to funding, recommend strategies to reduce costs (the savings from which will be reinvested in special education, yet this will somehow reduce costs) and study and recommend standards and oversight to ensure that programs and services are delivered in a cost effective manner. The Task Force includes many representatives from the DDOE and school administration, four at large members appointed by legislators, one Governor's appointee, a representative from the teacher's union, three parents, a representative from GACEC and a representative from the Special Education Strategic Advisory Council.

It is worth noting that the percentage of students in Delaware with IEPs is around 15%, which is entirely consistent with national averages (see attached document from US DOE). Special education services cost more than traditional services; special education services will continue to represent a fairly large piece of any education budget. The increase nationally and in Delaware of children with special education needs is a complex issue that may be beyond the capacity of this Task Force. The SCPD recommends involving the Statewide ADA/Section 504 Coordinator, as well as representatives from DPH, and other state agencies to gain a better understanding of Delaware's demographics and health trends.
